Encyclopedia Judaica:

Nearly 3 Million Polish Jews murdered during the war.

Only 369,000, 11% of the Prewar population survived.

The latter figure includes:

1,000 posed as gentiles (1/2 of those who tried).

13,000 joined the Polish Army

250,000 fled and ended up in the Soviet Union (40% never made it back to Poland.

The United States 1920's system favored people from Northern and Western Europe. If you were born in Germany the quota was four times higher than if you were born in Poland.

President Truman worked steadily to change the biased system. When he finally got the Displaced Persons Acts of 1948 and 1950 passed, 100,000 Jews entered the United States.
